



## Use of Pupil Premium at Grove Junior School

In 2011-12 the Government launched its Pupil Premium funding. This money is sent to schools based on the numbers of pupils in the school who are eligible for Free School Meals (FSM), Children Looked After (CLA) and children from armed forces parents. From 2012-13 this was expanded to include all children who have been eligible for FSM within the last six years.

The money is allocated to initiatives to ensure pupils reach their full potential, both academically and socially.

<b>1:1 Tuition</b>	Focused 1:1 teaching weekly, in maths & literacy for 2 CLA		
<b>Cover for Y6 Teachers</b>	To provide cover in class for writing conference – 3 hours per week.		
<b>Specialist Teachers – Small group work</b>	Focused group teaching for writing & maths		
<b>Specialist Music teacher work</b>	One to one tuition – literacy support		
<b>One to one tuition</b>	One to one tuition – literacy support		
<b>Teaching Assistant Intervention &amp; Support</b>			
<b>Write Away</b>	TAs working one to one with pupil premium children to develop their editing skills in writing		
<b>Reading Challenge</b>	Focused 1:1 reading support from TAs and INCO over a six-week period, with specific objectives. (20% of TA budget is from PPG)		
<b>Language Support</b>	Focused 1:1 and small group language support, to follow up S&LT advice, plus additional TA support to develop language skills (EAL pupils) and pre-teach vocabulary – within 20% of TA budget		
<b>In class targeted TA support</b>	Within 20% TA budget a high proportion of support time is used to enable accelerated progress of PP children within each class		
<b>Extracurricular enrichment</b>	Children funded to attend after-school enrichment clubs
