# What we are learning at school

#### Maths

We will looking at these areas of maths this term:
Place Value and Rounding
Multiplying and dividing by 10, 100 and 1000
Properties of number
Mental strategies for multiplication and division
Interpreting negative numbers
Addition and subtraction using a range of strategies including formal written methods
Formal written multiplication and area

# English

We will be studying the book Coming to England by Floella Benjamin. We will be highlighting racial equality and diversity and incorporating opportunities to develop spoken language and text engagement.

We will also be studying Wolves in the Wall By Neil Gaiman to develop grammar and sentence construction. Cloud Tea Monkeys

by Mal Peet and Elspeth Graham will be used to further work on grammar and sentence construction. Journey by Aaron Becker will be our last text of the term.

# Science

In our science lessons we will be looking at the Earth, Sun and Moon. We will develop our understanding of their place in the solar system and how night and day occur, as well as seasons. We will also look at how our understanding of the solar system has developed through history. For our second science unit, we will be looking at the properties of materials. We will organise and classify materials based on their properties and investigate how they perform as thermal insulators.

Museum websites to see the ancient Greek artifacts that have. What do they tell you about the people that owned them. Ancient Greek Myths – why did the Greeks use story telling as part of their religion?

In computing, we will be looking at staying safe online. We will also study spreadsheets and databases.

#### French

In French, we will be learning giving directions and buying food.

## Music

Our Music Curriculum will have 3 inter-related strands running through it; an instrumental strand, a listening strand and a theory strand. The focus is as follows:

Listening: We will investigate how music has changed through history and we will compare musical features in two specific works – 'Mars' from The Planet Suite by Gustav Holst, and 'Earth' by Hans Zimmer

Instrumental: We will create a class soundscape composition with sections linked by ostinato melodies.

Theory: We will study some simple conventional music notation, learning how to compose and read simple 4 beat phrases.

## RE

We will be looking at sources of wisdom within the Jewish faith. We will examine the role that sacred texts play in the lives of followers of the Christian and Jewish faiths.
