Music

In music, we will discover the importance of music for the ancient Egyptians. We will also listen to music from Egypt and explore how certain pitch patterns create music which sounds 'Egyptian'. We will also look at how Egyptian hieroglyphs can communicate musical ideas and become a form of music notation.

RE

In RE this Summer term, we will be looking at Justice and Fairness including the work of development charities eg Water Aid, Friends of the Earth and Oxfam. The second topic is called Human Responsibilities and Values where the children will learn about a Sikh's responsibility to serve others in the Langar and look at the different religious codes/ world views for living.
