Uniform

Medical

- Inhalers: Please ensure your child has an in date, named inhaler in school at all times. They are kept in a box in the classroom. It is the responsibility of parents to check expiry dates on all medication.

- Inform the office of any medical conditions, changes or updates

- New spelling pattern words are given out on FRIDAY and are due back in school on the following THURSDAY. This allows a full week including a weekend to practice, investigate and explore the current spelling patterns.
- Children are expected to write a sentence for each spelling word which will show their understanding of definition. This will also provide an opportunity to practise expanding sentence structures.
- The usual high standards of presentation should be maintained. Please use a suitable blue pen.
