Using an analogue clock (watch, clock face) regularly ask you child to tell you the time. Discuss duration of events and the time it takes to complete a task.

Discuss conversions between units of measures (eg: ml to l) and how to switch between them.

Continue to learn time tables and corresponding division facts. Play card games

Science

Living Things and their Habitats- we will be able to describe the differences in the life cycles of a mammal, an amphibian, an insect and a bird. We will also be able to describe the life process of reproduction in some plants and animals

Animals including Humans- we will be able to describe the changes as humans develop to old age and identify some characteristics that will not change with age.

History

The Ancient Maya Civilisation - we will be looking at the achievements of the Ancient Maya

Geography

Local Area Study field work - we will be focusing on the 3Rs - Reduce, Reuse, Recycle

Natural resources.

D&T. We will be designing and making mechanical systems, with pulleys and gears and learn how mechanical systems such as cams or pulleys or gears create movement

Art

We will be looking at artists Andy Goldsworthy and Maximo Laura and will explore the use of different textiles through weaving.

Computing

We will be creating Concepts Maps and 3D Modeling along with developing word processing skills.

French

En Vacances- Ask and say where you are going on holiday. Express opinions about holidays. Talk about what you are going to do on holiday. Talk about holiday plans

Reading

Encourage your child to read to you as often as possible. Use the VIPERS prompts at the back of the planners to help with questioning.

Reading at home includes everything with words on. Children of all ages still enjoy being read to.

Writing

Encourage your child to keep a journal and write letters to family and friends.

Spellings

Encourage your child to learn words from the Year 3 / 4 and Year 5 / 6 Statutory word lists. Make word searches and crosswords using focus spelling patterns and words from the statutory lists.

With your child, practise spelling words several times a week. Games like Boggle and Scrabble are excellent for encouraging correct spelling and discovering new vocabulary.

Talk about:

Online safety- how do you stay safe when using the internet (children and adults)

Current affairs – Listen to your child's opinions and discuss age appropriate news items. How do they make sense of what is going on in the world?

We will be continuing to compose, perform, and listen to a wide variety of music. The material presents an integrated approach to music where games, the dimensions of music (pulse, rhythm, pitch etc), singing and playing instruments are all linked.

We will also have an introduction to playing the Ukulele with a focus on understanding the different methods of playing the instrument as well as beginning to develop an understanding of the strings and how they can be used to create a variety of sounds.

Homework expectations

Reading: Encourage your child to read often and hear them read at least 3 times a week. Children must record 5 different incidents of reading in their planners each week.

Spelling: Children will be given spellings to learn and practice each week. They may choose how they practice based on the spelling sheet in their books but should be encouraged to do this several times over the week to ensure the learning is embedded. Where appropriate, pupils will be given a dictation on the spelling pattern learned. Please help your children with their words and encourage them to learn the weekly patterns.

Mathletics: This will be set weekly and be based on our in-class learning. Whilst help from parents is appreciated, pupils should complete Mathletics as independently as possible to show their true understanding. If a pupil scores 50% or less, they should re-do the homework.
