

Uniform

- Please ensure that your child wears the correct uniform in school. All items must be clearly labelled, including shoes
- Long hair must be tied back securely with either black or red hair ties. Adornments such as large bows, fascinators and oversized accessories are not suitable for school.
- Coats/rain jackets in school every day (break time/home time)
- It is recommended that children remove earrings on P.E. days to meet Health and Safety guidelines. Ideally, send your child to school without earrings on P.E Days. Pupils are responsible for earrings removed in school.

Medical

- Inhalers: Please ensure your child has an in-date, named inhaler in school at all times. Inhalers are kept in a box in the classroom. It is the responsibility of parents to check expiry dates on all medication.
- Epipens: Same as inhalers.
- If your child wears glasses / hearing aid, please ensure that they have them in school daily and, that we know about them.
- Inform the office of any medical conditions, changes or updates

Home Learning-Planners

- Mathletics-1 or 2 activities assigned weekly to complement class learning.
- Spellings- New spelling pattern words are given out on FRIDAY and are due back in school on the following THURSDAY. This allows a full week including a weekend to practice, investigate and explore the current spelling patterns.
- Reading-Please listen to your child read aloud as often as possible (min 3 times a week). Encourage your child to read for at least 10 minutes everyday and record the date and page numbers read in their planner.

Home Learning

- Children will be able to visit the library in small groups throughout the week.
- Encourage regular trips to the local library please join. It's a great resource and skill and definitely an alternative to Google and Wikipedia!
- Encourage your child to read all the clocks at home, both analogue and digital. Calculate duration of time that tasks may take. Continue practising times tables.
- From time to time, we may politely ask for your support in providing some resources to enhance the children's learning.
