What we are learning at school	How you can help at home
Maths We will be looking at these areas of Maths this term: -Calculation (mental and written) -Geometry including properties of 2D and 3D shape and perimeter. -Multiplication and Division with times tables -Fractions (Finding Fractions of Discrete and Continuous Quantities) -Ordering and Comparing Fractions -Adding and Subtracting Fractions -Formal Written Multiplication -Problem solving and reasoning tasks will be included in all units.	Visit - Visit a farm or zoo to see a variety of animals, linked to our science. What do they eat? Are they an apex predator? Are they an omnivore, carnivore or herbivores? What skeleton do they have? An endoskeleton, exoskeleton or hydrostatic skeleton? -Linked to RE can you visit a place of worship? How do they pray? Who is their god? -Linked to our UK Geography learning, find a location in Britain that contrasts to Harpenden and visit in the holidays! Discuss the physical and human features in that location.
 English -First we will be studying the book 'Coming to England' by Floella Benjamin. This is a memoir of her experience of moving from Trinidad to England as part of the Windrush generation. We will be focusing on letter writing. -We will also be looking 'Atlas of Adventures' by Rachel Williams, which is an amazing non-fiction book! We will learn how to use persuasive writing techniques, persuading our audience to travel to incredible places. -We will continue to develop our grammar skills, focussing on: conjunctions, clauses, subordinate clauses, prepositions, the present perfect tense, higher level vocabulary for description – adverbs, adjectives and figurative language. -We will also be looking at 'The Three Little Wolves and the Big Bad Pig' and writing our own fairy tale inspired story. Reading

Reading will continue to have a high profile, exposing the children to a variety of fiction, non-fiction and poetry texts.

Texts we are using: Disney Songs, Stuart Little, The Enchanted Wood, The Reluctant Dragon

Science

<u>Animals and Humans</u>: Big Question – Why do diets differ throughout the animal kingdom? We will explore what makes a balanced diet and why different animals have different dietary needs.

We will also learn about the different types of skeleton, what the purpose of a skeleton is, the different types of joint in the human skeleton and how muscles work.

<u>Light:</u> Sources of light, reflective materials, how light travels, how shadows are created, darkness is the absence of light, an introduction of how light helps us to see - looking at the eye.

History

In History, we will be learning about four ancient civilisations: The Ancient Sumer, The Indus Valley, Shang Dynasty of Ancient China. We will also briefly touch upon Ancient Egypt before we explore this in further depth in the Summer Term.

Geography

United Kingdom - Locational Study

Is the United Kingdom the same all over? We will look at three contrasting regions in the United Kingdom.

We will demonstrate knowledge of the United Kingdom, explain and locate all regions of UK using maps and describe some key physical & human geography features including geology, making different coast lines.

Art

In Art, we will be studying Digital Photography. We will be exploring the use of perspective. We will also be learning how to modify a digital image.
